PASTORAL STATEMENT ON THE CAYE CAULKER MARIJUANA REFERENDUM

Belize City, Belize – As the people of Caye Caulker prepare for the upcoming referendum on the legalization of marijuana, the Roman Catholic Diocese of Belize City–Belmopan offers this guidance. The voice of the Church remains steady: as Christians and citizens, we are called to protect life, defend families, and pursue the common good in our beloved nation, Belize. The Catholic tradition reminds us that our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit (1 Cor. 6:19–20).

Pope St. John Paul II warned that drug abuse "impoverishes every community where it exists." Pope Francis has spoken just as clearly against attempts to legalize recreational drugs, declaring that "drug addiction is an evil, and with evil there can be no yielding or compromise." He warned that legalization is "highly questionable" and fails to solve the problem. Instead, he urged us to say "yes to life, yes to love, yes to others, yes to education, yes to greater job opportunities."

For this reason, Belize cannot afford to legalize marijuana. Experience in other countries shows the harm that follows. If legalized, marijuana will:

- Harm our youth making drugs seem normal, lowering learning ability, and increasing dropouts.
- Damage families impairing parents, fuelling violence, and weakening bonds of love and care.
- Threaten health leading to more addiction, depression, accidents, and mental illness.
- Undermine tourism driving away family visitors and replacing them with drug-seekers.
- Strengthen crime giving cartels and black markets more opportunities to profit.
- Corrode moral values sending the message that intoxicants are acceptable, even desirable.

As followers of Christ, we are called not to escape life but to embrace it. Marijuana does not build Belize up; it tears Belize down. For these reasons, the Diocese calls on all Catholic faithful and people of goodwill in Caye Caulker to form their consciences and to vote "No" in the referendum. This is a civic duty and a moral responsibility to protect our children, preserve our families, and keep Belize a jewel, not a casualty of drug culture.

Let us pray together for wisdom and unity in this moment of decision.
